- M. Application to replace existing deck at 9 King Street. <u>Applicant is requesting an 8" variance</u>. This development application is to replace an aging deck that already exists, with an 8" variance in our setback. A variance of this small amount is within the 10% allowance that can be approved by Council. As CAO I do not have permission to grant variances, but I have reviewed and see no concern with it.

S. Dangerous, Hazardous & Unsightly Premises. 80 Main Street.

Several notices have been issued recently by our Bylaw Officer to the owner of 80 Main Street asking them to bring the property into compliance with our bylaws. To date no action has been taken. The condition of the building continues to deteriorate with each passing year as it has been left vacant and neglected. There are many visible signs including broken windows, holes in the roof, deterioration of the foundation, and more, that pose several hazards to the public as well as neighbouring properties. In 2015 the Town of Souris had to remove the back section of the building that had fallen into the ground after the owner neglected to do so. The owner did reimburse the Town for those costs. **Our Bylaw Officer is recommending** that Town Council take the next step which would involve legal action in order to have the property brought up to code. We have also received notice of concern of this same nature from the neighbouring property owners as well.
