G. Eastern Kings Sportsplex Update – CBCL has extended an invitation to local contractors to submit proposals to repair the roof at the rink with a proposed budget of \$50,000. This will be a temporary fix only until such time the roof can be replaced. If Council approves, we can apply to the Rural Growth Initiative Fund for up to 75% funding to help cover this cost. Our local Community Development Officer Chris Blaisdell has suggested we combine various projects into one application to the Rural Growth Initiative Fund. These projects may include: Upgrades to Matthew McLean Building; Repairs to EK Sportsplex Roof; Upgrades to Ballfields at Jerry McCormack Complex and G. Clinton Field, as well as a potential new construction of a Dog Park for the community. I have put together a budget for each. (attached). Potentially we could get up to 75% funding.

A requirement of the application process is a resolution by Town Council supporting the project(s).
