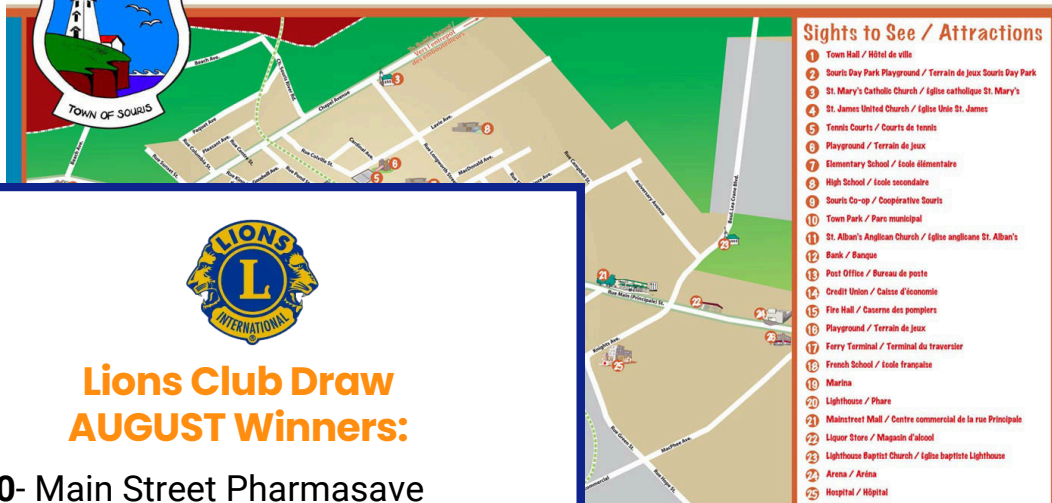

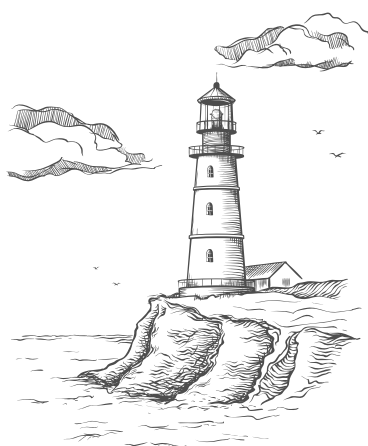

Club plays at Souris Regional School, 15 Longworth Street, Souris from 7:30pm to 9:30pm in the small gym.

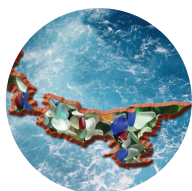
Our adult club is open to students age 13 and older. The first two nights are free and membership is only \$30.

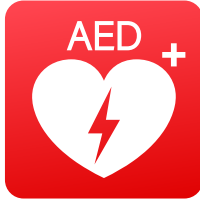

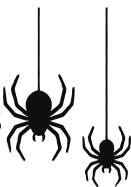

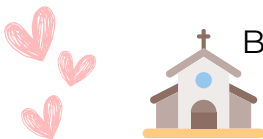

If you require a burning permit, you must apply with the Province, the Town of Souris does not issue burning permits for any area of the municipality.

The municipal bylaws for burning are located on the Town of Souris website.

In the Town of Souris, Prince Edward Island, burning regulations are outlined in **By-law No. 85-4: Garbage Burning**. This by-law prohibits individuals from burning or incinerating grass or garbage on any property—commercial, residential, or recreational—without prior written consent from the Town Council and approval from the Fire Chief.

The Fire Chief determines the appropriate type of incinerator to be used for such activities.

Violations of this by-law result in fines: \$50 for the first offence and \$100 for each subsequent offence.

****Additionally, during the wildfire season (March 15 to November 15),** provincial regulations require checking daily burning restrictions before any outdoor burning. You can check current restrictions or call 1-800-237-5053.

For more information or to obtain necessary approvals, contact the Town of Souris at 902-687-2157.

Burning permits are not required for Category 1 fires.

Category 1 fire specifications:

Piles no larger than three metres in diameter,

Piles no more than two metres high,

Multiple piles must be at least 10 metres apart from each other,

No more than two piles burning at one time,

Burning of tree limbs, leaves, brush or cut grass is permitted,

Includes campfires* except in licensed private, municipal, and provincial campgrounds, and **Fire must be attended at all times.**

*Campfires are any open fires** that burn no larger than 0.5 metres in diameter and are intended for recreation (and not for survival).

**Open fires are any fires not in an enclosed CSA approved appliance (e.g. propane or charcoal fueled appliances such as BBQs, propane or natural gas fire bowls, and Coleman-style camp stoves).

Chimneys are considered open fires.

Before burning you must check the Burn Restriction Map

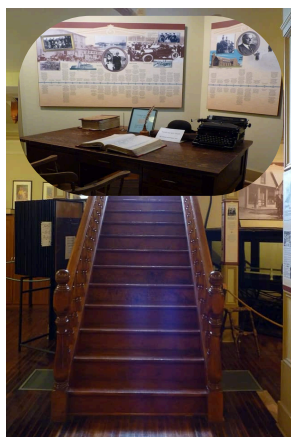

A Note From the RCMP:

It's a time for fun and excitement, but safety should also be a top priority. P.E.I. RCMP offer some critical safety tips for homeowners, trick-or-treaters and motorists to ensure that everyone has a safe and enjoyable Halloween.
- For homeowners: *Illuminated pathways: Make sure the pathway to your front door is well-lit, reducing the chances of tripping or slipping. This also let's trick-or-treaters know they're welcome!
- Secure pets: Pets can get spooked or overly excited with the influx of visitors. Keep them in a separate room to ensure both their safety and the safety of the trick-or-treaters.
- Fire safety: If using candles in your decorations, place them far from flammable materials and always monitor them. Consider using LED candles as a safer alternative in your pumkins.
- Offer packaged treats: Stick to offering store-bought, sealed candies to ensure they're safe for consumption.
- Keep pathways clear: Remove obstacles such as lawn ornaments and gardening tools from yards. Place decorations out of the way so that nobody trips.
- Curfews: Be aware of any community curfews.

SOURIS FIRE DEPARTMENT



Fire departments advise using flameless candles in jack-o'-lanterns and decorations, ensuring costumes are visible, fire-resistant, and free of long, trailing fabric, and checking smoke alarms are in working order. Other key safety measures include keeping decorations away from heat sources and exits, providing children with flashlights, and teaching them to "stop, drop, and roll" if their costume catches fire.

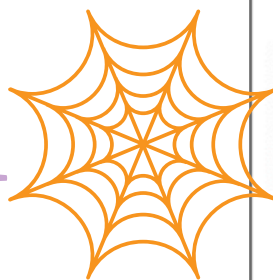

THE TOWN OF SOURIS DOG LICENSING PROGRAM

runs from June 1 to May 31.



Residents are required to annually register their dogs through this program in person at the Souris Town Hall.

We will need your name, address, phone number, email, the name of your dog(s), the color of the dog(s), the breed, male or female and whether they are spayed or neutered.

Dog tags are \$5 for spayed/neutered dogs and \$10 for non-spayed or non-neutered dogs



The Town of Souris enforces its animal control regulations through the Companion Animal Control By-law 2004-05. This by-law mandates that all dogs residing within the town must be registered and wear a valid dog tag. These tags are renewable annually and are essential for ensuring that lost pets can be promptly identified and returned to their owners
